

Curriculum Adoption

The Board of Education is required by state statutes to determine the educational programs to be carried on in the schools of the District. The curriculum shall be aligned with the District content standards to ensure that each student will have the educational experiences needed to achieve the standards.

Accordingly, after planning by the faculty and with the approval of the administration, all new programs and courses of study as well as the elimination and extensive alteration of the content of current programs and courses shall be presented by the Superintendent to the Board for its consideration and action.

Generally, new courses shall be introduced on a pilot basis and shall be evaluated at least annually by the curriculum modification and adoption committee. When the administration feels that a pilot course should become a regular part of the curriculum, such a recommendation shall be presented by the Superintendent to the Board for approval.
